Our Mission

Bring people together to build homes, communities, and hope.

Our Vision

An equitable Greater Paterson region where all people have access to the transformational power of safe, stable, affordable housing. During our 38-year history, we have built 285 new homes and served more than 350 families, adding approximately \$30 million to the City of Paterson's tax rolls. Overseas, Paterson Habitat has tithed over \$1 million resulting in an array of housing solutions made possible worldwide, particularly for vulnerable populations and communities hardest hit by disaster.



A Message from Scott

As I reflect back on our 2022 fiscal year I am most drawn to the metaphor of planting. Construction, like farming, is a seasonal and cyclical business, however unlike farming not all of our seasons and cycles always fit neatly in a single year. Sometimes there are years of planting followed by years of harvesting.

For Paterson Habitat for Humanity fiscal year 22 was a year largely spent digging, planting, and growing projects which will be harvested in fiscal years 23 and 24. In fiscal year 22 our team literally dug dozens upon dozens of truckloads of dirt and debris out of the ground, on over a dozen building sites, in order to create the conditions necessary for a stable home to be planted. We planted foundations for ten new homes, as well as a new home for the Albert Lawson Memorial VFW post in the City of Passaic, and we tended to the growth of those homes as they rose out of the ground, while also preparing the ground to plant nine more foundations. All of this digging and planting work will lead to a bountiful harvest of new homes in fiscal years 23 and 24.

In fiscal year 22 we also began the process of diversifying the crops we plant. We continued to plant the seeds for new single family homes, while we also planted seeds for our first mixed use development, new two-family models, and two critical repair programs, which will serve Paterson's Northside as well as five other Passaic County municipalities. We look forward to harvesting desperately needed affordable housing from all of these initiatives in the years to come.

Fiscal year 22 also saw the challenges facing our communities, and our work, continue to multiply. From the ongoing effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, to supply chain issues and labor shortages, to the rapidly rising costs of housing, both the need for our work, and the costs and complexities of meeting those needs grew. In the face of these needs we were both humbled and encouraged to receive the two largest individual donations in our thirty-eight-year history. We feel these gifts are endorsements of both the results we are achieving as well as our plans for the future. Through the creation of a strategic investment fund these gifts will be used to expand our mission impact for years to come.

None of this work would be possible without the tremendous support of each person who comes together to build homes, communities, and hope with us. From our staff, to our board, to our volunteers, to our individual, faith, service, foundation, and corporate partners, each one plays a critical role in our ability to continue pursuing our vision of a world where everyone has a decent place to call home. Thank You, each of you, for coming together to make fiscal year 22 successful and helping us plant the seeds for future homes to come in the years ahead.

Paterson & Beyond

135 Summer St., Passaic

We began fiscal year 2022 by embarking on our first solo project in the City of Passaic. On August 25, 2021, Paterson Habitat family and friends joined together with the City of Passaic, Mayor Hector Lora, and members of VFW Post 10117 at 135 Summer Street in Passaic.

As we watched the walls of the deteriorating home of the VFW Post 10117 come down, newfound hope in the community arose. Hope not only for the four families who will have their dream of homeownership realized, but hope for the veterans and auxiliary members of VFW Post 10117.

By March 2022, we were well on our way to seeing real progress when we broke ground and began the installation of the foundation for this reimagined and reconstructed home for the Albert Lawson Memorial VFW Post. The new hall will serve as a meeting place for the community, ensuring the continuation of the VFW program which supports 67 veteran members, the largest in the state. The second floor will become home to four homeowner families. This project marks many firsts for us. It is our first mixed-use project in our 38-year history and is helping us prepare for exciting future projects which are in the beginning stages of pre-development.




142-150 Governor St., Paterson (Governor 5)

Along with the start of a brand-new two-story mixed-use building in Passaic, we raised the walls on a new five-home development on Governor Street, in Paterson's 4th Ward in the fall of 2021.

The homes are eagerly awaited by the future owners. The past two years have added even more stress on all of our daily lives, and the certainty and safety of having your own home is a long awaited blessing to these families.

One of those families is Ana and her two children Noah and Paige. You may remember Ana's story from our Winter 2021-2022 newsletter published earlier this year. For most of her life, Ana has dealt with unresponsive landlords who ignored her pleas to fix the multitude of problems in her home. Ana and her children are currently living in one of Paterson Habitat's transitional rentals while anxiously awaiting the day Governor 5 becomes their new home.





When Ana purchases one of the Governor 5 homes, she will be the first in her family to own her own home. Ana says her goal is to break the cycle of poverty in her family. She believes owning her home will allow her family to have something that is theirs and will allow her to build so much more for her children's futures. Ana and the four other future homeowners of Governor 5 anticipate receiving the keys to their home in the fall of this year.

The Governor 5 homes are the first new affordable homes to be funded by the State's Affordable Housing Trust Fund in over a decade.

A Transformational Gift

Fiscal year 2022 was a history-making year for Paterson Habitat: we began work in the City of Passaic, our 300th new home in Paterson entered pre-development, and we received the organization's largest donation in our 38-year history.

On March 22nd, Paterson Habitat for Humanity, received a transformational gift of \$4.5 million from American author and philanthropist, MacKenzie Scott. The donation will substantially help further Paterson Habitat's vision of a Greater Paterson region where everyone has equitable access to a safe, decent and affordable place to call home.

This donation will allow us to invest more aggressively in expanding our services and mission impact across Passaic County. We are overwhelmed by the generosity of Ms. Scott and profoundly grateful she has chosen to put her faith in our ability to address the affordable housing crisis in our region.

She has sent a loud and clear message: We are worth the investment!

Paterson Habitat for Humanity will use this significant gift to invest in increasing our capacity and to serve more families in our community, which is currently facing an affordable housing crisis unlike any we have ever seen. In our hometown of Paterson, the price of a single buildable lot has increased more than fourfold since before the pandemic. The crisis is acute. There are not enough houses, let alone affordable units, available to meet the housing needs of our city, county, and country.

A gift of this size, especially during these challenging times, brings us renewed hope for the possibilities it creates and for the recognition it brings to the dedicated leaders, staff, and volunteers of Paterson Habitat.

Ms. Scott was not the only member of our community to confirm that the work we do is worthy of support. This past year also included a gift of over \$1 million from an active supporter of our vision who noted our mission must continue.

Expanding our Footprint

A New Name

Our donors are right, we and the communities we serve are worth the effort. Our mission must continue in Paterson and Beyond. To better reflect our existing scope of work, and the goals of our 40 & Beyond strategic plan, Paterson Habitat for Humanity will change its name to Passaic County Habitat for Humanity on January 1, 2023. As we



expand our footprint, we must acknowledge that the affordable housing crisis is crippling families across all of Passaic County.

While much of our home building has been confined to Paterson, our ReStore has been located in Wayne for the past 10 years. Further, over the past two years, building on previous collaborative development efforts in the City of Passaic, we embarked on our first solo development project outside of Paterson, the redevelopment of the Albert Lawson Memorial VFW Post, located at 135 Summer Street.

We will leverage the experience and expertise we have developed over the past 38 years to bring our traditional volunteer-supported homebuilding efforts, and a new home preservation solution, to all of Passaic County while continuing our work in our hometown of Paterson.


